How It Works

Our clean-up events are carefully organized for safety and impact. Here's how they typically unfold:

Event Planning and Coordination: We identify priority areas, coordinate with local authorities, and organize event logistics, including rules, regulations, supplies and waste disposal.

Volunteer Engagement: We recruit volunteers from schools, businesses, and community groups, providing multiple opportunities for participation.

Event Day: Volunteers meet for a brief orientation, receive safety instructions and all required equipment, then clean assigned areas.

Collection and Disposal: Collected litter is sorted for recycling and proper disposal at the Roseridge Waste Management Center.

Our Impact

With our inaugural event, Roseridge is taking the first step in revitalizing our community by organizing clean-up efforts to remove litter from roadsides and neighbouring properties. By reducing pollution and preserving local ecosystems, we are committed to creating a cleaner, healthier environment for everyone.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Organizations must sign the Clean-Up Agreement prior to participation.
- Mandatory orientation on the event day is requiredfor all participants.

\$200 per hour of litter collection on-site (minimum of 8 volunteers required).

- All volunteers must follow the <u>Alberta Highway</u> <u>Clean-Up Safety Guidelines</u>. Some program details, such as age requirements and garbage drop-off procedures, differ and will be reviewed at orientation.
- Preferred Clean-Up Area (if applicable): (Final assignments will be determined by Roseridge Waste Management Services Commission.)
